

Med LPN

The Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN), assumes responsibility and accountability for the application of the nursing process and the delivery of quality patient care. The nurse demonstrates ability to make clinical judgments in an effective and efficient manner with supervision. The LPN assumes self-responsibility for all patient care activities, as indicated by the Registered Nurse, within the scope of the Nurse Practice Act and the medical facilities policies and procedures. The nurse always demonstrates exceptional communication skills in a friendly and courteous manner.

Key Duties and Responsibilities:

- Utilizes the nursing process to assess, plan, implement and evaluate patient care.
- Assess signs and symptoms indicating physiologic and psychosocial changes in the patient's condition.
- Collects, analyzes, and interprets data and information from health care members and documents.
- Documents the patient's plan of care using identified nursing diagnoses, expected patient outcomes, and selected nursing interventions.
- Performs interventions according to identified priorities, plan of care, and the hospital policies and patient care outcome standard.
- Gives direct patient care according to the therapeutic plan and individual patient needs as directed by the plan and the Registered Nurse.
- Uses excellent clinical judgment to meet patient care needs of an assigned unit/floor including establishing priorities.

Minimum Requirements:

- Current Registered Nurse License for the State.
- Proof current MMR, Varicella, Hepatitis, TB, and FLU immunizations
- Two years professional nursing experience in required area.
- Current BLS, ACLS (if required)
- Submission of all HR requirements
- Negative 10-Panel Drug Screen
- Proof current Medical Liability Insurance
